- apply a high level of understanding of the effects of illness and disability and to provide specialist advice on suitable environments, assistive equipment, and housing adaptations
- undertake manual handling risk assessments and develop handling plans in relation to care; including the use of adapted manual handling techniques to incrementally improve an individual's capacity to be independent
- use a person-centred approach at all times respecting confidentiality, duty of care, client autonomy and risk management
- provide instruction, advice, and support to individuals/ informal carers/ family on the use of assistive equipment
- liaise with others and refer individuals as appropriate to assist in meeting their needs
- formulate and present accurate client-based and service reports
- appropriately delegate work to and supervise the work of Occupational Therapy Assistants, students, and volunteers as required
- be willing to undertake the role of fieldwork educator for student Occupational Therapists
